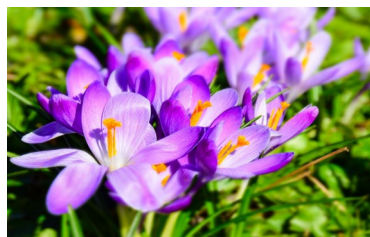

Hiroshima Day—August 6th 1945

This was the day when the United States dropped an atom bomb on the Japanese city of Hiroshima and also on the city of Nagasaki on August 9, 1945. Why were the bombs dropped on Hiroshima and Nagasaki?

There were several reasons why the atomic bombs were dropped.

One being that Japan would not surrender, they wanted to keep their emperor and conduct their own war trials and did not want to be occupied by U.S. forces.

Also the surprise bombings of Pearl Harbor during peace negotiations may have been one of the reasons that led to the atomic bombings of Hiroshima and Nagasaki. This started the beginning of WWII for the United States.

The bombings killed many civilians, between 129,000 to 226,000, on August 15, 1945.

There are many movies made of the World War II bombings and also many documentary films were made.

Purple Heart Day

August 7, 1782

This award is given to any military personnel, men and women, who were either wounded or killed in combat while serving in the U. S. Military and are considered heroes.

It marks the day of those who have made sacrifices and the award is presented to families of those who are no longer with us.

This is a day to say "Thank You" to the nearly two million brave men and women who fought for our nations freedom, and bear the physical scars of war.

In 1782 only three were awarded by General George Washington for bravery in action. There are some famous people that have received the purple here are just a few of the many men and women who have put their lives on the line for the freedoms we enjoy today. :

President John F. Kennedy,

James Arness, (actor)

Pat Tillman NFL Player

Roy Benavides, received five purple hearts!

Cordelia E. Cook First woman recipient of the Bronze Star and Purple Heart

Anthony was arrested and fined for casting her vote in a presidential election in 1872. In 1948, African American and Asian woman were allowed to vote. The Equal Pay Act was passed in 1963 to protect gender-based wage discrimination.

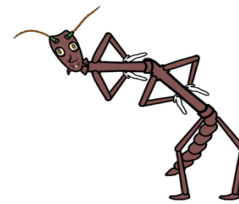
